Things to think about

This brochure includes support services, useful resource and uni contacts for young people in care or leaving care who are thinking about going onto TAFE or Uni.

If you are still at school here are some things to start thinking about:

- Subjects you like and are good at
- Things you love to do outside school
- Spending a day at a TAFE or Uni to find out about courses
- Preparing to meet the entry requirements

If you have left school there are supports available to help you with:

- Deciding what course might suit you and how to apply
- Meeting the costs of study and accommodation
- Linking into other services and supports such as transition programs, mentoring programs, literacy support and counselling services
- Preparing for and feeling confident about your studies

Supports and services for you

Financial Supports

- **Scholarships, bursaries and financial assistance** contact Federation Uni and La Trobe Uni using the details on the back of this brochure
- **Indicate you have been in care** to access supports/services by ticking the box on your application forms (VTAC or Uni)
- **Youth Allowance** for students between 16 and 21, or up to 25 if you are a full-time student. Call Centrelink 13 24 90 or search 'youth-allowance' at humanservices.gov.au
- **Study Assist** (financial support and info) studyassist.gov.au/sites/studyassist
- **Zero fee TAFE courses** if you are under 21 and leaving care. For the range of courses, search 'fee exemptions' at education.vic.gov.au
- **ABSTUDY** help for young Aboriginal people with study/apprenticeship costs. Call 1800 132 317 or search 'Abstudy' at humanservices.gov.au
- **Transition to Independent Living Allowance (TILA)** up to \$1500 for young people (15–25) leaving care via the Department of Social Services. Search 'TILA' at dss.gov.au
